Subject: SVRA Roll Bar and Cage Regulations

We have updated the SVRA roll bar guidelines and the SVRA General Rules and Regulations concerning roll bars and roll cages.

Suitable roll bars are required on all cars. The actual design is left up to the car owner, but should follow sound engineering standards. The SVRA roll bar guidelines are derived from SCCA and HA specifications.

We have **removed restrictive language about roll bar mounting points** from the SVRA roll bar guidelines, but the original intent of the regulations remain.

The basic purpose of the roll bar is to protect the driver if the car rolls over or is involved in a serious accident. Parts of the roll bar or roll cage deemed to serve no practical purpose other than chassis stiffening may be considered in violation of the intent of these rules and can be subject to weight penalty or reclassification.
